Snow Days:

If it snows, will there be school? The short answer is... YES! During extreme winter conditions, including heavy snowfalls, all schools in the Delta School District will remain OPEN, if at all possible. It is very rare that schools would be closed due to weather conditions or other circumstances. Schools may have a delayed opening to allow for district or municipal staff to clear safe routes to schools for students and families. Any closure or delayed opening will be decided by 7:00 am at the latest, and will be announced through the media as well as through district and school websites. Please note that no announcement will be made stating that schools are open. Only closures or delayed openings will be announced.

Announcements will also be made on the district website at https://www.deltasd.bc.ca. To keep phone lines clear we ask that you please refrain from phoning the school to check that we are open.

During extreme weather conditions, it is also common for police and other authorities to advise citizens to avoid unnecessary travel. Parents should take this advice as well. Parents/Guardians are responsible for their children's safe travel to and from school. If, for any reason, a parent/guardian feels that a child cannot travel safely to school, then they should make other arrangements. Schools will be kept open under extreme circumstances to provide the option of attendance for all, but the decision is the responsibility of each family. Should you choose to keep your child at home, please call the office and leave a message reporting your child's absence.

Weather Reminder:



The weather is definitely getting colder outside. Please ensure your children come to school dressed appropriately for playing outside at recess and lunchtime and also pack an extra pair of socks, shoes and pants into their backpacks for really rainy days! It is important for students to have fresh air and they will be going outside on rainy days.

Fall Flu Season:

The flu season is upon us, and we are experiencing slightly higher rates of absence than is normal at this time of year. At school, we are doing everything possible to keep Jarvis Traditional Elementary a healthy place to work and learn. All our students are receiving lots of reminders to wash their hands frequently, to cough into their elbows and to try and keep their work areas clean.



If your child is sick or exhibiting any of the symptoms of the flu, it is extremely important that you keep him or her home until all symptoms have disappeared. Please make sure to call the absentee phone line (available 24 hours a day) at 604-597-1768. Leave your name, your child's name and division number or teacher name.

Supervision Outside:



Please note that the outside supervision of students does not begin until 8:35 am in the morning before school. The school staff are preparing for the school day and often administration is in meetings with teachers before or after school. Students are not to be at school before that time, as we cannot ensure that there will be supervision for them until that time. After school, student supervision ends at 3:15 pm and students should be on their way home. Thank you for your understanding and your cooperation.

Winter Concert 2023:

The halls are filled with the rich sounds of students singing as our school excitedly prepares for the upcoming Winter concerts on Thursday, December 14th at 1:30 pm (afternoon performance) and 6:00 pm (evening performance)! I am pleased to announce that this year, all our classes will be participating in this event. For most presentations, our students will be performing in a "buddy class" format (two classes performing together).

As always, our students are VERY excited to be participating in a concert for their families and friends. Given the limited number of seats our school gym can accommodate, we encourage families to attend only one of the performances (1:30 pm or 6:00 pm). A notice went home to families last week providing parents an opportunity to inform the school about whether they plan to attend the afternoon or evening Winter Concert performance. Families opting to attend the evening performance should be aware that seating will be extremely limited (maximum of two seats per family), and tickets will be required for this performance. Tickets will not be issued for the afternoon performance.

Whether you choose to attend the afternoon or evening Winter Concert performance, all students are expected to participate in both performances. Over the past couple of years, we have noticed an increasing number of students not participating in our evening concert performances. It is very disappointing and disrespectful to teachers and classmates when students do not participate in the evening performance as they often have key parts in the presentations and the presentations are compromised when they are not there to perform them. In order to continue having evening concert performances, we must have full student participation in our evening concert performances!

Please note that this year's Winter Concert will be dedicated in the memory of Manny Reel. Ms. Reel was an Education Assistant at Jarvis Traditional for the previous five years. Ms. Reel passed away last July after a 10-month battle with cancer. Ms. Reel loved the holiday season and was passionate in her support of our annual Winter Concert. Admission to both the afternoon and evening concerts will be by donation with all donations going to a legacy fund in honour of Ms. Reel. Our hope, as a school, is to create a "sensory walk" in the main school hallway and purchase two "Friendship benches" in honour of Ms. Reel and all that she did to make a difference at Jarvis Traditional. Our Winter Concert will be the first in a series of fundraising initiatives for *Ms. Reel's Legacy Fund*. In addition to admission donations, the school will be running a 50/50 draw at each Winter Concert performance. Half of the proceeds from each 50/50 draw will go to the lucky ticket holder and the other half of the proceeds will go to *Ms. Reel's Legacy Fund*. Parents will also have the opportunity to enter a draw for a pair of front row seats to either the afternoon or the evening concert performance!! The proceeds from this draw will also go to *Ms. Reel's Legacy Fund*.

Late Arrivals and Absence Reporting:



It is very important that all students arriving after the 9:00 am bell sign in at the office and receive a late slip prior to going to their classrooms. Once your child has signed in and picked up a late slip it is not necessary for you to accompany them to their classroom. Your cooperation with this safety measure is much appreciated. Strong Start Program:

Strong Start is a <u>free</u> Parent Participation Early Learning Program at Jarvis Traditional. You can help your child learn early literacy, social, emotional, physical, and cognitive development through play with carefully selected materials and activities under the guidance of Early Childhood Educator, **Ms.**Mandy Gill. The sessions run Monday to Friday during the school year, from 9:00 am until 12:00 pm. The program is designed for children from 0 to 5 years, and their parent/caregiver, and you are invited to drop-in anytime.
