Jarvis Traditional Visitor Parking Lot Closed to Student Drop-Off and Pick-Up:

Please note that the visitor parking lot at Jarvis Traditional is closed for morning drop-off and afternoon pick-up. Our school was built at a time when most students walked to school, and our visitor parking lot was not designed to handle the volume of vehicles during morning drop-off and afternoon pick-up. Here are some suggestions regarding morning drop-off and afternoon pick-up:



- families can park in Gunderson Park and walk to Jarvis Traditional (an extremely short walk along a path to 118th Street)
- families that live in the subdivision are encouraged to walk to school
 - o this would help eliminate the traffic around the school
- for those students in Grade 3 and up, we encourage finding a meeting spot along the perimeter of the school where they can meet parents
- for those families with younger primary students (K-2), we encourage coming to school early and parking on the various streets that surround the school
 - o there are 4 entrances to Jarvis Traditional through different walking paths
- older siblings in the school are also encouraged to pick up their younger siblings and meet their parents at a designated spot

Please note, if your child is being picked up or dropped off for medical reasons during the school day, outside the normal drop off and pick up times, you may enter the parking lot to pick up and/or drop off your child. If you are dropping off lunch or other items for your child throughout the school day, again, please enter the parking lot. Also, if you are needing to volunteer at the school, drop off items to the office or meet with a teacher, you are welcome to use the visitor parking lot.

Registration for the 2025-26 School Year:

Our Kindergarten registration was held during the week of February 10 - 14. Please encourage neighbours who have not yet registered to do so as soon as possible.

We continue to take registrations for Kindergarten to Grade 7 placements at Jarvis Traditional Elementary. If you know of a family moving into our area, please encourage them to register their children as soon as possible to secure a placement at Jarvis for the upcoming school year.



Students already registered at Jarvis Traditional do not need to re-apply as they are already counted in our school's enrolment.

This is just a reminder to our Jarvis Traditional families that **report cards** were made available online through *Parent Connect* on Wednesday, March 12th (at or just after 3:00 pm). Take some time to read the report card with your child. Celebrate your child's successes! Scent Sensitivity:



At Jarvis Traditional, we have staff who suffer from respiratory difficulties that are made worse by scented products. We ask that students, parents, and staff do what they can to avoid using scented aftershave, hair spray, cologne, or other scented personal care products.

Life Threatening Allergies:

This is just a reminder to families in our community that several of our students have life-threatening allergies to peanuts and nuts (cashews, almonds, walnuts, pistachios, Brazil nuts, pecans, macadamias). Exposure to even tiny amounts of nut particles – residue on a desk, a book, a door handle, a computer keyboard, or a drinking fountain – may be enough to trigger a reaction. Please help us create a safe environment for them by keeping foods containing nuts, and peanuts at home. Several companies are now making nut-free snacks, and we encourage you to look for these new products when shopping. Label reading is the key to sending safe, nut-free foods to school. Please do your part to ensure our school environment is a safe one for all our students. THANK YOU!!



Late Arrivals and Absence Reporting:



It is very important that all students arriving after the 9:00 am bell sign in at the office and receive a late slip prior to going to their classrooms. Once your child has signed in and picked up a late slip it is not necessary for you to accompany them to their classroom. Your cooperation with this safety measure is much appreciated. The school phone has an answering machine

to record messages 24 hours a day.

Research has shown that the habits your children are forming now will have an impact on their future. As such, we would encourage students to make a concerted effort to arrive to school on time. Please help your child to develop the important habit of timeliness.

Lunch Time Reminders:

If you do not send your child with their lunch and you intend to bring it before 12:00 pm, please let your child know that he/she can pick it up on the lunch table at the front office. Parents are asked **not** to deliver the lunches directly to pod exits or classrooms and students are **not** allowed to go into the parking lot to get their lunches. Please leave the lunch on the lunch table.

This is just a reminder to parents that if you choosing to drop off a lunch for your child, please park your vehicle in the visitor parking lot. Please note that the round about is a FIRE ZONE and there is NO PARKING in the round about.
